GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

ITEM 5

GENERAL APPLICATION

The rules and charges published in this tariff will apply for the detention of all cars consigned to, or ordered by, subscribers served by the CWRO.

The disposition of a car at its point of detention determines the purpose for which the car is held and rules applicable thereto, except where there are specific tariff provisions to the contrary.

ITEM 10

STATION LIST AND CONDITIONS

This tariff is governed by the Official List of Open and Prepay Stations OPSL 6000 Series, to the extent shown below:

PREPAY REQUIREMENTS AND STATION CONDITIONS

For additions and abandonments of stations, and except as otherwise shown herein, for prepay requirements, changes in names of stations, restrictions as to acceptance or delivery of freight, and changes in station facilities.

For geographical locations of stations referred to in this tariff.

ITEM 15

EXPLOSIVES, DANGEROUS ARTICLES

The rates in this tariff, insofar as same are to apply on explosives and other dangerous articles, will be applied in connection and in compliance with regulations governing the transportation thereof, as published in Freight Tariff BOE 6000 Series.

ITEM 20

Letter suffixes will be used in alphabetical sequence starting with "A". Example: Item 445-A cancels Item 445, and Item 300-B cancels 300-A. in a prior supplement, which in turn, cancelled Item 300.
