RULES AND OTHER GOVERNING PROVISIONS GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

ITEM 5

PREPAYMENT OF CHARGES

The LRPA reserves the right to require prepayment of charges published herein.

ITEM 10

REFERENCE TO TARIFFS, ITEMS, NOTES, RULES, ETC.

Where reference is made in this tariff to tariffs, notes, rules, etc., such references are continuous and include supplements to and successive issues of such tariffs and reissues of such items, notes, rules, etc.

ITEM 20

CONSECUTIVE NUMBERS

Where consecutive numbers are represented in this tariff by the first and last numbers connected by the word "to" or a hyphen they will be understood to include both of the numbers shown.

If the first number only bears a reference mark, such reference mark also applies to the last number shown and to all numbers between the first and last numbers.

ITEM 30

DEMURRAGE AND STORAGE RULES AND CHARGES

Charges herein will be subject to Demurrage and Storage Rules and Charges as provided in Tariff ASLG 6004-series.

ITEM 40

METHOD OF CANCELLING ITEMS

As this tariff is supplemented, numbered items with letter suffixes cancel correspondingly numbered items in the original tariff or in a prior supplement. Letter suffixes will be used in alphabetical sequence starting with A. Example: Item 445-A cancels Item 445, and Item 365-B cancels Item 365-A in a prior supplement which, in turn, cancelled Item 365.

SECTION 1 MISCELLANEOUS RULES AND CHARGES

ITEM 100

SET-BACK CARS AND CARS DELIVERED IN ERROR

A charge of \$330.00 per car (loads and/or empties) will be assessed against the carrier which delivers cars to the LRPA in error for return of the car; and/or cars to be setback.

ITEM 110

CARS ORDERED BUT NOT USED

When order for cars for loading is canceled or car is returned empty, a charge of \$225.00 per car will be assessed against person, firm or industry ordering such car (See Notes 1 and 2).

Note 1 - Charge will not apply on cars not being in proper condition to load, see Item 120.

Note 2 - Applicable Demurrage Charges will apply. [A]

ITEM 120



CARS NOT SUITABLE FOR LOADING

When cars ordered for loading are refused or rejected on account not being in proper condition to load, a charge of \$225.00 per car will be assessed against the carrier furnishing such car.

ITEM 130

SHIPMENTS OF EXCESSIVE DIMENSIONS, WEIGHTS, ETC.

The LRPA will not accept from shipper or connecting carrier for transportation shipments of excessive dimensions, excessive weight, high center of gravity or other conditions requiring special handling without the LRPA first being contacted in advance to obtain authorization for such shipments.

(Charges in dollars and cents per car, except as noted)

ITEM 200

DEFINITIONS OF RECIPROCAL / INTERCHANGE, INTRA-PLANT, INTRA-TERMINAL, AND INTER-TERMINAL SWITCHING

RECIPROCAL / INTERCHANGE - A switching movement between customers served by the LRPA at Little Rock, AR and interchange with connections (BNSF; UP) when in connection with or part of a road haul movement.

INTER-TERMINAL SWITCHING - A switching movement from a track of one railroad to a track of another railroad when both tracks are within the switching limits of the same station or industrial switching district.

INTRA-PLANT SWITCHING - A switching movement from one point to another point within the same plant or industry.

INTRA-TERMINAL SWITCHING – A switching movement (other than intra-plant) from one track to another track of the same railroad, or between the track(s) of an industry and the track of the railroad or between the tracks of two separate industries served by the same railroad.

ITEM 210

SWITCHING CHARGE ON LOADED CARS HELD FOR INSTRUCTIONS

In the absence of specific provisions to the contrary, the following will apply:

When on shipper's/consignee's order, loaded cars are removed from industry or team tracks and held by carrier awaiting instructions, the intra-terminal or inter-terminal switching charge, as the case may be, will be assessed for the movement, such charge will be in addition to all other charges applicable and will not be absorbed.

(Provisions formerly shown herein and not brought forward are hereby canceled.)
