Provisions formerly published in Tariff TRRA 8001-B and supplements issued thereto, and not brought forward herein are hereby cancelled.

RULES AND OTHER GOVERNING PROVISIONS GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

ITEM 10

STATION LISTS AND CONDITIONS

This tariff is governed by Tariff OPSL 6000-series to the extent shown below:

PREPAY REQUIREMENTS AND STATION CONDITIONS

(a) For additions and abandonments of stations, and, except as otherwise shown in this tariff, for prepay requirements, changes in names of stations, restrictions as to acceptance or delivery of freight, and changes in station facilities.

When a station is abandoned as of a date specified in the above named tariff, the rates from and to such station as published in this tariff are inapplicable on and after that date.

GEOGRAPHICAL LIST OF STATIONS

- (b) For geographical locations of stations referred to in this tariff by station numbers.
- (c) For the identification of stations when stations are shown or referred to by numbers in this tariff.

ITEM 15

EXPLOSIVES, DANGEROUS ARTICLES

For rules and regulations governing the transportation of Explosives and Other Dangerous Articles by Freight, also specifications for shipping containers and restrictions governing the acceptance and transportation of Explosives and Other Dangerous Articles, see Tariff GRM 6000-series.

ITEM 20

REFERENCE TO TARIFFS, ITEMS, NOTES, RULES, ETC.

- (a) Where reference is made in this tariff to tariffs, items, notes, rules, etc., such references are continuous and include supplements to and successive issues of such tariffs, and reissues of such items, notes, rules, etc.
- (b) Where reference is made in this tariff to another tariff by number, such reference applies also to such tariff to the extent it may be applicable on intrastate traffic.

ITEM 25

TERMINAL OR TRANSIT PRIVILEGES OR SERVICES

Shipments made under the rates contained in this tariff are entitled also to terminal and transit services and privileges, and are subject to the charges, allowances, rules and regulations legally applicable thereto, as provided in separately published, lawful tariffs.

EXCEPTION

When provisions of this tariff specifically cover any such charge, allowance, rule or regulation, corresponding or conflicting provisions in such separate tariffs will not apply.

ITEM 40

CONSECUTIVE NUMBERS

Where consecutive numbers are represented in this tariff by the first and last numbers connected by the word to or a hyphen, they will be understood to include both of the numbers shown.

If the first number only bears a reference mark, such reference mark

also applies to the last number shown and to all numbers between the first and last numbers.

RULES AND OTHER GOVERNING PROVISIONS GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

ITEM 45

CAPACITIES OF CARS

Governed by Freight Tariff WTL 6300-series for gallonage capacities of tank cars.

ITEM 60

NATIONAL SERVICE ORDER TARIFF

This tariff is subject to provisions of various Service Orders and General Permits as shown in Tariff NSO 6100-series.

ITEM 75

METHOD OF CANCELLING ITEMS

As this tariff is supplemented, numbered items with letter suffixes cancel correspondingly numbered items in the original tariff or in a prior supplement. Letter suffixes will be used in alphabetical sequence starting with A. EXAMPLE - Item 60-A cancels Item 60, and Item 80-B cancels Item 80-A in a prior supplement, which, in turn cancelled Item 80.

ITEM 205

APPLICATION OF SWITCHING RATES

Switching rates provided in this tariff apply only on traffic having origin or destination beyond the St- Louis-East St. Louis switching limits, as specified in Items 340 and 345, which is line-hauled by carriers named herein; on traffic moving through St. Louis, MO or East St. Louis, IL via all rail; and also on barge-rail or rail-barge traffic when the charges published herein are assumed in whole or in part by carriers named herein.

For switching rates applying on traffic between points both of which are within the St. Louis-East St. Louis switching limits, as specified in Items 340 and 345, see the following tariffs, viz.: TRRA 3023-series.

RULES AND OTHER GOVERNING PROVISIONS SPECIAL RULES AND REGULATIONS - UNLIMITED

ITEM 235

DOUBLE LOADS

Articles which on account of their length require two or more cars for their transportation will be charged for at actual weight, subject to the minimum weight provided in this tariff or the established carload rate for each car used. No charge will be assessed for Trailer or Idler cars supplied by the railroads because of shifted loads.

ITEM 242

TURNING CARS

When cars not properly placarded as to which side or end is to be used for loading or unloading are tendered to the Terminal Railroad Association of St. Louis with a subsequent request for turning of the car prior to placement, a charge of \$64.00 per car will be assessed for the service of turning.

Cars not properly placarded as to which side or end is to be used for loading or unloading which are ordered turned after placement will be assessed the local switching charge applicable for such movement as published in Freight Tariff TRRA 3023-series. (Note 1) NOTE 1. If bill of lading carries notation that car has been placarded and placard has disappeared before placement, the charge named herein will not apply.

ITEM 244

INSTRUMENTATION TEST CAR

Self-contained engineering research car equipped with devices capable of the measurement, while car is in transit in normal freight train service, or vibration, shock and other forces acting upon and affecting other cars in the train and equipped to handle permanent performance data for the benefit of the operator and carrier will be handled by Terminal Railroad Association of St. Louis for the following charges:

Between any connecting lines at St. Louis, MO and-or East St. Louis, IL, \$130.00 per car per move. (Note1)

NOTE1 - These rates do not include the cost of running repairs nor any services such as storage, electricity or water.

ITEM 245

INTRASTATE APPLICATION OF TARIFF

This tariff is applicable on intrastate traffic only where expressly provided in connection with particular items or rates.

ITEM 250

MOVEMENT OF LOADED AND EMPTY CARS

Except where otherwise specifically provided to the contrary, rates provided in this tariff cover the movement of a loaded car one way and the return of the empty car; or the placing of an empty car and the return of the loaded car. If cars are loaded in both directions, regular charge will be applied on each movement.

EXCEPTION

The following exception will apply in connection with the TRRA. If any empty car is ordered for loading and the service of switching or placing it has been performed and the car is not loaded, the regular switching charge provided in this tariff will be collected from the person, firm or corporation ordering such car.

Shipments for delivery on public team tracks will not be accepted from connecting lines when handled for switching revenue only.

EXCEPTIONS

ITEM 300

STOP-OVER CARS, BILL OF

Cars intended for stop-over on the rails of TRRA, must be billed direct to the specific stop-over point. The route beyond the rails of the carriers named in this item and the ultimate destination, may be shown in bodies of waybills covering shipments of this nature.

ITEM 305

SWITCHING CHARGES TO FOLLOW OUTBOUND SHIPMENTS

On traffic originating within the switching limits of St. Louis, MO and East St. Louis, IL, and destined to points beyond the switching limits of St. Louis, MO and East St. Louis, IL, switching charges may follow shipments to receiving line.


